- Why Film Criticism Matters
- Debunking Myths
  - More than just "thumbs up/thumbs down"
  - Not inherently negative
  - Must consider the larger artform
- Video
  - Siskel and Ebert <u>The Biggest Arguments</u>

- Reviews
  - Short-form
  - Audience-focused
- Essays
  - o Thematic
  - Analytical
- Academic Analysis
  - Deep research
  - Film theory

  - Summary (concise, no spoilers)
  - Analysis (narrative, cinematography, sound, themes)
  - Context (genre, director, historical significance)
